Gold Angel (5.0% ABV) This medium-bodied golden ale has a light malt and citrus hop character.

 ∇ Saint George (4.5% ABV)

Chestnut/amber brown in colour; this is a traditional full-bodied English bitter brewed with Sussex Hops, malted barley and South Downs water.

🔽 Smoked Ale (4.7% ABV)

A derivation of Ginger Nol - brewed without the ginger, leaves this beer with a deep and satisfying smoky flavour. It is deeply warming for the long cold winter nights.

☐ Triple Champion (4.0% ABV) This chestnut-coloured traditional English ale is deeply flavoured and full-bodied.

ADUR BREWERY Steyning, West Sussex

- Black William (5.0% ABV) This is a rich black stout with chocolate aromas and roasted flavours.
- Happily Ever After (5.0% ABV) A golden ale created to celebrate the forthcoming Royal Wedding.
- Hanging Judge (ABV tbc) This is an unusual Coffee Stout; being brewed as we go to press.

Very Merry Andrew (9.2% ABV)

This black strong ale contains wheat oats and barley, with dark malt and subtle coffee/chocolate tones in the taste, there is some sweetness before the dry finish.

ARUNDEL Ford, West Sussex

Black Stallion (3.7% ABV)

A dark mild with strong chocolate and roast aromas, which lead to a bitter taste. Slight aftertaste where the initial flavours remain in the dry clean finish.

□ Sussex Giant (5.0% ABV)

A strong pale ale, the creation of which was inspired by the Long Man of Wilmington, the mysterious 226ft figure cut into the steep slopes of Windover Hill, near Eastbourne.

Sussex Gold (4.2% ABV)

This golden-coloured ale has a strong floral hop aroma. The ale is clean tasting and surprisingly bitter with a tangy bitter flavour and a long dry finish.

Trident (5.0% ABV)

This amber-coloured strong bitter has a citrus, fruity aroma. The taste is clean and refreshing with a hoppy, fruity flavour and a pleasant dry bitter finish.

BALLARDS Nyewood, West Sussex

 \Box Anniversary Ale (4.0% ABV)

A pale gold bitter brewed using four hop varieties for a mouthful of bitter but fruity flavour with a long dry finish. First brewed in June 2010 by Sussex CAMRA members to celebrate 20 years of Yapton Beer Festival; now tweaked by adding another hop variety.

∇ Best Bitter (4.2% ABV)

A copper auburn coloured beer with malty, fruity hoppy aromas. Full bodied, with soft fruit flavours and a dry finish.

Golden Bine (3.8% ABV)

A lovely golden yellow beer with floral lemon fragrance and soft citrus flavours and a sharp dry finish. Brewed with Pearl malt and a touch of wheat, combined with Golding and Fuggle hops.

Midhurst Mild (3.5% ABV)

Traditional mahogany brown mild, smoky, roasted nutty aroma, with sweet, molasses and dark chocolate flavours. Brewed with Pale Ale, Crystal & Chocolate Malts and Fuggle Hops.

BEACHY HEAD East Dean, East Sussex

Legless Rambler (5.0% ABV)

This ale uses the brambling cross hops which give it a distinct flavour. The name was derived as a tribute to all those who walk the wonderful South Downs Way from Winchester to Beachy Head and celebrate accordingly.

↓ Original (4.5% ABV)

"Original Ale" is produced with only water; floor malted barley (optic and crystal) and Challenger Hops from English producers. It is English bitter with a strong hoppy flavour and light floral notes.

 ∇ South Downs Ale (4.4% ABV) This pale bitter ale has sweet bitterness and floral characteristics. Well-balanced ale produced using malted barley and hop flowers. DARK STAR Partridge Green, West Sussex American Pale Ale (4.7% ABV) An American yeast strain along with Cascade, Centennial and Chinook hops are used in the recipe for this golden, dry, seriously hoppy beer. Hophead Citra (3.8% ABV) The brewers' love affair with zesty aromatic hops continues with this alternative version of Hophead using Citra as the single hop variety for bittering and aroma. Six Hop Ale (6.5% ABV) Brewed with five different hop varieties in the copper and then dry hopped after fermentation; this pale beer is designed for those who like their hops as an extreme sport. FALLEN ANGEL East Hoathly, East Sussex Angry Ox Bitter (5.3% ABV) This powerful, broad shouldered, deep red beast of burden makes no apologies for its sturdy alcohol content, and heavy handed bitterness. St Patrick's Irish Stout (3.9% ABV) The impressive richness of chocolate malts and roasted barley make this beer nearly black in colour, robust in aroma, and silky in texture. FILO The First In Last Out, Hastings, East Sussex Cardinal's Porter (4.6% ABV) A dark porter with burnt caramel, malt and a dry finish with coffee and hops. ∇ Crofters Best Bitter (3.8% ABV) A fine quaffing amber ale, richly hopped with Fuggles and Goldings to give a refreshing nutty flavour with just enough dryness to make you want more. Ginger Tom (4.6% ABV) A light-brown beer with some hoppiness and a ginger flavour. Gold (4.8% ABV) Golden premium ale pleasantly flavoured and lightly hopped. **GRIBBLE** The Gribble Inn, Oving, West Sussex Gribble Ale (4.1% ABV) A golden beer with a full fruit flavour of apricot and peaches. - Red Hunter (4.3% ABV)

Skydog (5.4% ABV)

A pale strong bitter with masses of fruity lemon and lime hop flavours, finished with a long spicy bitterness from a combination of classic American hops.

EXMOOR Wiveliscombe, Somerset

Gold (4.5% ABV)

A yellow/golden best bitter with a good balance of malt and fruity hop on the nose and the palate. The sweetness follows through an ultimately more bitter finish.

FALLONS Darwen, Lancashire

Crbial Glow (4.2% ABV) Light, fragrant and flowery with depth of flavour from American Amarillo hops.

FAT CAT Norwich, Norfolk

Cougar (4.7% ABV)

Fat Cat's palest beer yet - the result of using lager malt for a more gentle malt flavour. American hops, whose citrus aromas burst out with a wonderful freshness, dominate the flavour, as you'd expect, and lead into a crisp dry finish.

FORGE Hartland, Devon

Litehouse (4.3% ABV) Light with a citrus bite.

FULLERS Chiswick, London

☐ Gales HSB (4.8% ABV)

A good, consistent interpretation of the flagship Gale's beer. A rich, complex traditional bitter; sweet and full-bodied with dark fruit aromas and hints of caramel, leading to a bittersweet finish.

FYNE ALES Achadunan, Argyle

Jarl (4.0% ABV) A full-on citrus experience; light and golden, with a fruity, malty finish.

Vital Spark (4.4% ABV)

A very dark ale with a glorious reddish glow. A full-bodied mild ale rich in taste with a dry finish.

GOACHER'S Tovil, Kent

Real Mild Ale (3.4% ABV) A moderately bitter mild with chocolate malt and hints of roast barley and coffee.

Old 1066 (6.7% ABV)

Named after the original gravity of the brew, this fruity rich barley wine has been produced in small quantities every winter since 1983.

GREEN JACK Lowestoft, Suffolk

Baltic Trader (10.5 ABV)

This is extra strong Export stout is smooth, rich and fruity with roasted coffee and vanilla flavours. It celebrates the North Sea sailing ships that traded between East Coast ports like Lowestoft, and the Baltic Sea ports.

Mahseer IPA (5.0% ABV)

Brewed with English bittering hops and American aroma hops, and named after the legendary Golden Mahseer freshwater fish from northern India.

HAMBLETON Melmerby, North Yorkshire

Cocky Jockey (4.0% ABV) A seasonal beer for March; sorry no further information.

HARVIESTOUN Alva, Clackmannanshire

Shenanigans Black Lager (4.2% ABV) This is a black lager brewed with roasted barley. "Refreshing and unique yet strangely familiar." A seasonal beer for March.

HAWKSHEAD Staveley, Cumbria

Damson Stout (4.3% ABV) An Oatmeal stout brewed with Damsons look out for a hint of vanilla in this version.

Lakeland Gold (4.4% ABV)

Fresh, well-balanced fruity, hoppy beer with a clean aftertaste.

HEART OF WALES Llanwrtyd Wells, Powys

Noble Eden Ale (4.6% ABV)
 A dark brown premium ale bursting with fruit and malt, with just a hint of chocolate to tickle the taste buds. This is a full bodied flavoursome, satisfying pint.

HIGH HOUSE FARM Matfen, Tyne & Wear

Nel's Best (4.2% ABV)

igcap Golden hoppy ale full of flavour with a clean, bitter finish.

HOGS BACK Tongham, Surrey

TEA/Traditional English Ale (4.2% ABV)

A tawny-coloured best bitter with both malt and hops present in the nose. These carry through into a well-rounded flavour with malt slightly dominant and more fruity sweetness than bitterness.

Hop Garden Gold (4.6%)

Pale golden best bitter. Full-bodied and well-balanced with an aroma of malt, hops and fruit. Hoppy bitterness grows in an increasingly dry aftertaste with a hint of sweetness.

A over T/Aromas over Tongham (9.0% A.B.V)

This full-bodied, tawny-coloured barley wine is packed with flavour. The malty aroma with hints of vanilla, leads to a well-balanced taste; where the hops cut through the underlying sweetness and dominate in the finish.

A light gold speciality beer flavoured with lemongrass.

Ilkley Black (4.0% ABV)
 A dark and velvety mild made with chocolate and roasted malts to give a rich and satisfying flavour.

IRVING Portsmouth, Hampshire

Illustrious (4.7% ABV)

A light golden pale ale with mandarin and lemon hop notes on the nose. This "lusty" ale has a resinous challenger hop flavour complimented with a light sweet malt character, the finish is a lasting bitterness with floral hop notes.

Admiral Stout (4.3% ABV)

A classic dark Oatmeal stout, brewed with a combination of Roasted Barley, Chocolate Malt and Crystal Wheat Malt to give a deep black colour and Oat Malt to give a smooth rounded malt flavour, balanced with a strong bitterness from Fuggles and Sovereign Hops.

A copper-coloured traditional bitter; lots of biscuity malt and background hoppiness. Long malty finish. Winner of "Beer of the Festival; Bury 2010"

ISLE OF AVALON Ashcott, Somerset

Chocolate Orange Stout (4.5% ABV)

Dark brown beer; orangey oils in the flavour with some sweet chocolate backing it up. Semi dry finish.

KELHAM ISLAND Sheffield, South Yorkshire

Easy Rider (4.3% ABV)

A pale, straw-coloured beer with a sweetish flavour and delicate hints of citrus fruits. A beer with hints of flavour rather than full-bodied.

LANDLORDS FRIEND Halifax, West Yorkshire

Mr JK's Irish Stout (4.4% ABV) A taste of Ireland, brewed in Yorkshire!

LEES Middleton Junction, Greater Manchester

\Box Vindehop (3.8% ABV)

This is a new beer with Challenger, Bramling Cross and Perle hop varieties, brewed to accompany the spiciest of curries.

Mersey Mist (4.0% ABV)

A pale cloudy wheat beer flavoured with oranges and lemons with a hint of coriander.

MARBLE Manchester

Ginger (4.5% ABV) Intense and complex. Full-bodied and fiery with a sharp, snappy bite.

Pint (3.9% ABV)

A pale, dry and extremely hoppy ale.

MAYFIELDS Leominster, Herefordshire

 \Box Aunty Myrtle's (4.5% ABV) A dark copper-coloured ale with gentle malt flavours and strong hop finish.

A beer for March brewed with Target and Progress hops grown in Ashperton Nr Ledbury.

MILLSTONE Mossley, nr Oldham

✓ Tiger Rut (4.0% ABV) A pale, hoppy ale with a distinctive citrus/grapefruit aroma.

MOORHOUSE'S Burnley, Lancashire

Pendle Porter (5.0% ABV)

This brand new brew created by Mark Bennett; dark in colour with a sweet edge balanced by the chocolate malt and roasted barley. The hoppy pine aroma taste comes from English Fuggle hop and Green Bullet hop from New Zealand.

NETHERGATE Pentlow, Essex

Old Growler (5.0% ABV)

Well-balanced porter in which roast grain is complemented by fruit and bubblegum.

NOTTINGHAM Nottingham

Rock Ale Mild (3.8% ABV) A reddish-black malty mild with some refreshing bitterness in the finish.

Supreme Bitter (5.2% ABV)

A strong amber fruity ale. A touch of malt in the taste is followed by sweet and slightly hoppy finish.

OAKLEAF Gosport, Hampshire

I Can't Believe it's not Bitter (4.9% ABV)

A cask-conditioned lager - Clean and crisp with a fruity aftertaste. The use of Saaz hops gives this lager a citrus finish that lingers on.

Blake's Heaven (7.0% ABV)

Strong, dark and rich, yet surprisingly drinkable for a beer of its strength. A substantial beer that should be treated with caution!

☐ Quercus Folium (4.0% ABV)

A traditional mid-brown bitter with an initial malty flavour leading to a long hoppy finish.

O'HANLON'S Whimple, Devon

Port Stout (4.8% ABV)

A black beer with roast malt in the aroma that remains in the taste but gives way to hoppy bitterness in the aftertaste.

ORKNEY Quoyloo, Orkney

Dark Island (4.6% ABV)

The roast malt and chocolate character varies, making the beer hard to categorise as a stout or an old ale. A sweetish roast malt taste leads to a long - lasting roasted, slightly bitter, dry finish.

Crazy Dog Blonde (4.0% ABV) Looks like lager but with taste, aroma and body. So it's not like your average lager at all; it goes down easily and is great if you want a bit of a session.

RED SQUIRREL Hertford, Hertfordshire

Redwood American IPA (5.4% ABV) Based on a secret Michigan recipe, this original American IPA contains the highest quality malts, producing an ale which is golden orange in colour, with complex hoppy aromas with floral and citrus tones with a long lingering finish.

Danish Dynamite (5.0% ABV)
 A strong, dry ale, slightly fruity with a well-balanced, bitter hop flavour.

STRINGERS Ulverston, Cumbria

No. 2 Stout (4.0% ABV)

Roasty nose. Some grain and dark toast. Firmly bitter. A seriously drinkable low ABV. Suitable for vegans.

SUMMER WINE Honley, West Yorkshire

Elbow Grease (3.8% ABV) A golden ale that packs a big punchy hop flavour with citrus and grapefruit notes. Maybe not one for Kevin.

SURREY HILLS Shere, Surrey

Hammer Mild (3.8% ABV)

A traditional dark mild with a wonderful malt base and mouth-feel. Delicate hop characters are present to complement the malt flavour.

Shere Drop (4.2% ABV)

Pale in colour with a hint of grapefruit and lemon in the aroma. The hop bitterness complemented by malt. Long moderately dry finish.

Chiron Pale Ale (5.0% ABV)
